One fun day we went from having two teenagers in the house to having three teenagers in the house when we were granted custody of one of our daughter's friends. YeJin fit in perfectly with our other two daughters because she was sweet and funny and artistically gifted. The second she became part of our family she became a part of our hearts.

YeJin carried a lot of emotional pain and we didn't know how powerful it was until it was too late. On March 6, 2017 YeJin took her life. Our lives and our hearts will never be the same.

Two brave people from LOSS came to our house that night; I don't remember who came because all I could see was shadows. I don't know what they said because I couldn't focus on words. Thankfully
